Suggested Topics

FOR TEACHERS

Links with the Western Australian HASS, English and Media Arts curricula.

Some examples:

Year 1 (HASS) History Curriculum – exploring how family life has changed over time, concepts of then and now, old and new.

Year 1 Media Arts Curriculum – experimenting with images and text to communicate ideas and tell stories.

Year 2 History – exploring the history of the local area and why the past is important to the local community; significant people, buildings, sites.

Year 2 Media Arts – capturing, selecting and arranging images and editing text to organise important features of a story.

Year 3 History – the role of different cultural groups in the development of the local community, origin and significance of days commemorated in Australia.

Year 4 History – Australia's first peoples and the ways they are connected to country/place. Pre-contact life and nature of contact post British settlement.

Year 5 History – British colonies and the significance of individuals or groups in shaping the Swan River Colony.

Year 6 History – Experiences of Australia's democracy and citizenship including Federation and the status and rights of Aboriginal people, Asian migrants, women and children. Year 7 History – Conserving the ancient past including the heritage of Aboriginal Peoples.

Year 8 (HASS) Civics and Citizenship – perspectives on Australian identity and how Australians can actively participate in their democracy.

Year 9 History – Investigating World War 1

Year 10 History – Investigating World War 2 and Australians' rights and freedoms from 1945 to the present.

Year 11 and 12 – use the process of historical inquiry to question and evaluate sources, identify various representations of history, use evidence to formulate and support historical interpretations and communicate findings in a variety of ways.
